#### A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Don't know if you are familiar with the name Will Rogers? I got to know of him especially because of my years pastoring in the great state of Oklahoma. Will Rogers is a part of Oklahoma's rich heritage of characters and "stand-outs" from that state. He was an American stage and film actor, <u>vaudeville</u> performer, <u>cowboy</u>, humorist, newspaper columnist, and social and political commentator from <u>Oklahoma</u>... and quite a character by all rights. He was born in November of 1879 in the <u>Cherokee Nation</u>, <u>Indian Territory</u> in Oklahoma. Known as "Oklahoma's Favorite Son," Will Rogers was born into a <u>Cherokee</u> family. As an entertainer and humorist, he traveled around the world three times, made 71 films (50 <u>silent films</u> and 21 "talking picture shows" as they were called), and he wrote more than 4,000 <u>nationally syndicated</u> newspaper columns. He was widely quoted for his folksy and whimsical statements that seemed to strike a cord with most everyone. By the mid-1930s, Will Rogers had become hugely popular in the United States because of his political humor, and he had become the highest paid <u>Hollywood film</u> star of his day. He died in 1935 with aviator <u>Wiley Post</u> when their small airplane crashed in northern Alaska.

One of his most famous quotes, often repeated, had to do with being thankful. It seems that even in his day there were many who took much for granted, failed to give thanks for what they did have no matter how little it seemed to them, and perhaps were often looking for something for nothing as if they were owed it. Will Rogers said this, "Thanksgiving Day... in the days of its founders they were willing to give thanks for mighty little, for mighty little was all they expected. But now neither government or nature can give enough but what we think it's too little. Those old boys in the Fall of the year, if they could gather in a few pumpkins, potatoes and some corn for the winter, they was in a thanking mood. But if we can't gather in a new Buick, a new radio, a tuxedo and some government relief, why we feel like the world is agin' us." Will Rogers wrote that statement in his syndicated column in November of 1934. The nation was still in the throes of the great depression, and life in the U.S. was difficult at best. We think today we have had it pretty rough... during that time not only was the country experiencing severe economic depression, but there was the "dust-bowl" going one, homelessness was of epic proportions, they were just emerging from their own pandemic that had killed more than twice the numbers we have experienced from COVID and with a much higher death rate, and they were about to head into a major world war. Scary times! People may have been wondering what did they possibly have to be thankful for in all of the bad that was going on. Some today may have the same thoughts. What is there to be thankful for? With so much bad, where is the good? And as Will Rogers seemed to imply, "We aren't much in a thanking mood because of it!" But I like his statement, "...they were willing to give thanks for mighty little, for mighty little was all they expected." I'm reminded of another statement... more of a response I hear from time to time when inquiring how someone is doing! I'll say, "How are you?" And they will respond, "Better than I deserve!" You get the sentiment? Right? What they are saying is that life may not be perfect, and things may be tough, but God in His grace is good and has blessed beyond measure. I think that's true really!

The Apostle Paul, himself, must have felt the same. He is so often saying things like, "In everything give thanks..." in 1 Thessalonians 5:18, and "Give thanks always for all things..." in Ephesians 5:20. This from one who was experiencing some things in his life that would be mighty hard to give thanks for... beatings, mockings, imprisonments, server persecution, sicknesses, many griefs in the loss of brothers and sisters killed for the faith in his day. I don't know about you, but I feel like we really have nothing to complain, bemoan or gripe about... not really. And I don't say that to minimize what you personally may be going through, but simply to say that we have much... much to be thankful for and let me fully quote Paul's words in 1 Thessalonians 5:18, "In everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." It's His will! I want to be more like those of Will Rogers day that he spoke of, "Those old boys in the Fall of the year, if they could gather in a few pumpkins, potatoes and some corn for the winter, they was in a thanking mood." It shouldn't take much for us to give thanks. God is so good!
