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A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

We sing it every Sunday. You might even want to sing it out loud now as you are reading these familiar words, *“I’m so glad I’m a part of the family of God. I’ve been washed in the fountain, cleansed by His blood! Joint heirs with Jesus as we travel this sod, for I’m part of the family, the family of God.”* I hope it is not so familiar to you that it has become devoid of meaning. It is one of Bill and Gloria Gaither’s most well-known and well-loved songs, and they have written hundreds. The song was born out of a tragedy in their home church in which they witnessed their church family rally around a hurting family and minister to their needs in an unusual way. As Bill and Gloria Gaither witnessed the love and out-pouring of their church they said to one another, “You know, they’d do the same for us if we were hurting!”

I’m sure you’ve probably heard this statement before, “If you find the perfect church don’t join it because it will no longer be perfect.” I’m not sure I like that statement much, though I know there is much more than just a smidgen of truth to it. The statement just seems a bit trite, cliché, and worn... and truth be known, a bit insensitive and brusque, somewhat curt to the ones who may have been injured in church and are looking for one that will help them heal, and in a more unspoiled way worship and serve their Lord. We have our sneaking and uneasy suspicions that there are no perfect churches on this side of heaven. I think we know that, and every church has its problems. Really, many of us at times have found ourselves longing to be part of the perfect church... the church that is just right... the church that you have always been longing for. But we have to be honest with ourselves at this point, that no such church exists.

Now let me contradict my own shallow and “imperfect” understanding a bit and make what is perhaps a surprising statement. The Bible actually tells us that the perfect church is a reality. Maybe it has more to do with our definition of the perfect church. Maybe... just maybe that has been the problem. Maybe it’s in how we define the perfect church? Our definition of the perfect church is dominated by things like a pastor that preaches appealing and practical sermons, worship music that stirs us, presentations that are flawless, programs that address our felt life needs, or a well-kept, finely tuned facility. And there is nothing wrong with any of those things in and of themselves. I believe that we ought to always strive to offer our utmost for His highest... as we say. But ultimately our definition of a “perfect church” usually concentrates more on the programs that make the church perfect for us and our needs, rather than the people who make the church perfect, and beautiful, and spot-on for us. And I might add, since we have struggled in defining what the perfect church really is, we further err in determining those things that are really important to the life of the church. We get so busy with programs and the plans and the

property and the possessions that we forget that the church is really the people.

Paul writes in Colossians 3:12-14, *“¹²Therefore, as God’s chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. ¹³Bear with each other and forgive whatever grievances you may have against one another. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. ¹⁴And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity.”* That is what the church ought to look like. Listen to how the New Living Translation reads those verses, *“¹²Since God chose you to be the holy people whom he loves, you must clothe yourselves with tenderhearted mercy, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. ¹³You must make allowance for each other’s faults and forgive the person who offends you. Remember, the Lord forgave you, so you must forgive others. ¹⁴And the most important piece of clothing you must wear is love. Love is what binds us all together in perfect harmony.”*

If you are receiving this newsletter chances are you probably are a church-goer, so you have at least a fairly good view of the church. There are a lot of different things that people say about churches... some negative and some positive. I’ve learned that you pretty much find what you are looking for in churches. If you come with a negative attitude looking for the negative, you will probably find it. If you come with a critical attitude looking for something to criticize, you will certainly find it. If you come with a judgmental attitude looking for something to judge, you will surely find it. On the other hand, if you come looking for the beautiful, you will find it. If you come looking for warmth, kindness, fellowship, sharing, love, and community, you will probably find it. If you come seeking Jesus, you will find Him. If you come with an open, honest, and willingness to love and be loved, you will find it. You pretty much get out of a fellowship of believers... a church... what you put into it. Pretty much!

I am hearing more and more, all the time, some wonderful things said about our church... how warm and welcoming it is, how comfortable visitors feel when they come. I know that there are some that may be critical, and negative, and judgmental, who may have had a bad experience, who may have been hurt or injured by some unfortunate circumstance. I’m sorry that things like that happen, but this is, unfortunately, the nature of the inhabitants of the body of Christ... the church. Again the church is made up of imperfect people who mess up sometimes... sometimes a lot... and God loves them and treasures them immensely. I don’t mind telling people that we are not a perfect church... far from it! We are not a perfect church, but we do serve a perfect Lord who has a perfect love for this imperfect church, and as a church, this group of believers has much to offer. I love this church. I love you! I love First Baptist Church of Buda for any number of reasons. Christ loves the church. He gave His life for

the church. He is coming back to get His church. His church, you have much to offer a world that is hurting and searching for answers. With so much to offer as a church let me encourage you to be a part of building up the body of Christ and not tearing down the body of Christ... His church.

The writer of Hebrews said it well in Hebrews 10:25, *“Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching.”* Thank you for being that kind of a people... that kind of church family. Keep it up and keep coming, and sharing, and loving, and growing, and encouraging, and serving Jesus. Let’s be that Colossians 3:12-14 kind of people. **God Bless You! Bro. Buddy**
