The song seemed all jumbled, Louis and Nancy tried to join in. The choir started humming, as if the tune they knew, Now the congregation was singing and tapping their shoe. The Deacon's were swaying, locked all arm in arm, Soon gave me to know that they really meant no harm. Their lesson seemed simple and straight to the heart, "What Christmas is, and where it should start."

We do so much planning, and working, and fixing and things, We sometimes miss what the Season really means. It's not about all our programs, and shows we put on. YOUTH RE+MIND

The hand of the Lord was upon me, and he brought me out in the Spirit of the Lord and set me down in the middle of the valley; it was full of bones. And he led me around among them, and behold, there were very many on the surface of the valley, and behold, they were very dry. And he said to me, "Son of man, can these bones live?" And I answered, "O Lord God, you know." – Ezekiel 37:1-3

So, this year I am figuring out something about the Christmas novelty that I love more than Christmas lights, which have always been my favorite. What has usurped throne for me however is the joy of watching my daughter's enjoyment of the Christmas lights. Now that she's at an age where she can verbalize her feelings, every evening drives my heart warms at the sound of: "Daddy look, there's Christmas!" Now I want my girl to grow up with correct theology, but I don't correct her. But, in a way the aweinspiring beauty of the lights in the early evening darkness serves as a pretty good illustration to what exactly Christmas is.

This passage at the top of the article is not exclusively an advent passage but it is extremely gospel rich, and I think it does well to communicate the awe-inspiring beauty in the midst of our darkness. In our world these days the question God poses to His prophet in this vision is one that I think we all ask ourselves, "can these bones live?" or in other words "is there any hope?" For Ezekiel he was looking at a valley of scattered dry bones, for us we look at a world that is falling further away from God's word. Ezekiel's answer I think is an interesting one because it is an admission of his own limitation to see how this can happen, but it is also a confession that the answer belongs to God. That is to say "If you want them to God, these bones can live" because He has the answer. That is the hope that is still with us to this day, in the midst of the darkness and uncertainty of how God is moving, we know He holds the answer, and we know He's good so we can trust His answer. We know how the story ends with Ezekiel's vision with a rattle of bones, and breath of life the dry bones live, and with the coming of Jesus Christ the light of the world into this darkness we see God's answer to all of our questions as well. *Trey*
