When I was a boy I used to tie my old rusty wagon to the back of my bike. Still have the wagon. It's in my back yard holding plants. Don't have the bike anymore, but it was cool... green metallic with a banana seat. Anyway, with the wagon trailing behind my bike, my brother and I would comb all the ditches of the main road leading to town picking up coke bottles. Those things were like gold to us. You remember. I guess to two ornery little boys who didn't have much sense, a couple of cents was like gold. When our wagon was full, we'd pull 'em to town to "Tenorio's Grocery Store" and get our paycheck, then spend it all on a sugary buzz of penny candy and a Big Red. Ah! The days! We'd thought we hit pay dirt with our business scheme to take advantage of what dumb people just threw away.

Mom and dad used to take us as kids to Wimberley, to a place called "Pioneer Town," located on the 7A Ranch. It was an old western ghost town... a kids dream place. I loved it, but in that place was a house made completely out of coke bottles. I mean it! Walls, ceilings, the roof, even the windows were a stained glass mixture of soda pop bottles.
