A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

With a new year ahead of us and some rather challenging and shockingly unexpected ones behind us, one has to wonder what a new year will look like, what this next year and the future will bring us. We know some big things are surely going to take place in the coming year that could very well shape and define our nation... in fact some things that could well be predictive of whether or not our nation survives according to some. There will be a big presidential and national election that could prove to be highly controversial and divisive. We've already begun to see the tidal wave of a culture and society that has literally become the definition of insanity, and trends seem to indicate that wave is growing with overwhelming intensity. The instability of our world with dictator regimes running amuck and threatening instability in all sectors of the globe, terrorist organizations now being supported by our own government, our porous borders now being flooded daily with those coming across illegally with sinister intents for our country, even terrorist coming in unhindered. All of this without even mentioning the instability now flooding our religious institutions and churches. The writer of Hebrews said it just like that in Hebrews 12:1-3, "Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart."
